## Partners Gather in Novara, Italy for 2nd Project Meeting

CUBIC partners convened from April 19th to 21st in Novara, Italy for their highly anticipated 2nd project meeting. The meeting was organised by NOVAMONT, a CUBIC's consortium partner. During the first day the partners engaged in depth discussions regarding the progress made since the beginning of the project, the identification of challenges and roadblocks and outlined plans for future activities. Each partner presented updates on their individual contributions, sharing significant milestones achieved and valuable insights gained so far.

During the second day, the participants had the opportunity to visit NOVAMONT facilities and laboratory, to attend an interesting training session regarding polymer synthesis, biobased products, and market regulations.

CUBIC is a Horizon Europe project, aiming to develop and demonstrate novel circular biobased alternative materials, 100% recyclable by design. These new materials will be manufactured as B2B intermediate semi-finished products that can be used either individually or assembled in the final end-user product. The overall objective of these new bioproducts is to provide an alternative biobased solution to the manufacturing industry by boosting green and digital transformation. The CUBIC consortium, led by Aitiip, consists of 13 partners from 8 European countries (ES, FR, IE, BE, DK, DE, IT, GR).
